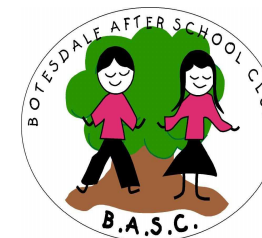

Botesdale Breakfast Club aims to provide quality, affordable childcare in a safe, fun and social environment, which is accessible to all children and guarantees parents/carers peace of mind.

We operate from St Botolphs Primary School Monday – Friday mornings, 7.45 am -8.45 am. We provide care for up to 16 children aged 3 to 11 years. The children will be dropped off at the back of St Botolphs Primary School (classroom opposite the staff room) where they will be met by Botesdale Breakfast Club staff. We also offer a drop off service at no extra cost for children who attend Wortham Primary School and Mellis Primary School, please contact us for more information.

OUR STAFF

Our staff are qualified and experienced. The Play-Leader and Play workers have been selected for their enthusiasm and commitment to creating a child-led environment. We encourage staff to continue training for higher qualifications.



Working With Suffolk County Council.

BASC is managed by a voluntary management committee, with invaluable help and advice from Suffolk County Council. The committee meets regularly and has a constitution to control its activities.

Partnership with Parents.

We operate a 'Partnership with Parents' policy, to encourage feedback from children and parents to staff and committee. We welcome members to support us in fundraising, donating equipment, and serving on the committee. We rely on the support of all our members.



Membership.

Membership of BASC is open to parents, guardians and carers of children in local schools and others. Details of membership will be held in accordance with our Confidentiality and Data Protection Policy.

Annual Subscription.

The annual family subscription for 2011/2012 is £6.00. This entitles children to attend our After School Club if parents wish to us it and this will cost £7.50 for the first child and £6.50 for siblings.

Session Fees.

Fees to be charged for attending each morning will be £4.00 per session for each child. You will be invoiced half termly. Our business plan includes provisions for the fees and staff costs to rise annually, at least in line with inflation.

Safeguarding Children Statement.

BASC is here to serve children and families. We will listen and keep private anything you have to say to us. However, we have to inform the Child Protection Agencies if we are worried about the care a child is receiving.
